7AM - 6PM

- All parents are required to sign his or her child in and out each day. ID is required when someone other than the authorized parent is picking the child up.
- All campers must wear their camp T-shirt on Field Trip Days apart from swimming days.
- Transportation is provided for all field trips.
- Breakfast & lunches will be provided daily by the Metro Action Commission.
- Daily snack are provided by the camp.
- Tennis shoes/socks to be worn daily (no flip flops).

### CAMP ATTIRE

Because we often walk outside, we ask that you consider allowing your child to wear tennis shoes or closed toe shoes daily. This will help prevent glass injuries, insect stings and/or bug bites. Participants are encouraged to wear clothes that fully cover the body in sun sensitive areas to prevent sunburn.

On field trip days, please dress your child in his or her camp T-shirt. The uniformity of the group helps employees better attend to each child. \*Except for Swim Days

### LUNCH & SNACKS

Nashville's Metro Action Commission will provide breakfast and lunch for each camper. Lunch will consist of a sandwich, milk, juice, and fruit. Your child is not required to take part in this meal. The camp will provide snacks. A different snack will be served daily. Campers are welcome to bring a packed lunch.

# **ABOUT CAMP ZION**

**Camp Zion offers an unforgettable summer day camp experience** tailored for children entering 1st through 9th grades. Our focus is on enriching biblical knowledge, enhancing academic skills, fostering character development, nurturing new relationships and of course ensuring maximum fun! This camp is designed to empower youth across various aspects of life, including emotional, educational, physical, social, psychological, and economic well-being.

Each day at Camp Zion is packed with activities such as daily chapel, academic sessions, physical exercise, sports, leadership workshops, and elective classes that will leave your children eager for more.

Campers can arrive as early as 7 a.m. with morning chapel starting promptly at 8 a.m. Pick-up times vary depending on elective classes, with the latest pick-up time being 6 p.m. Selected students may be asked to stay later as preparations for the closing program approach.

Located at Mt. Zion Baptist Church on Old Hickory Boulevard in Whites Creek, TN, just a short 15-minute drive from downtown, Camp Zion provides indoor and outdoor facilities, exciting field trips, leadership training, music, dance, and more, ensuring a summer full of enriching experiences.

Our caring staff includes a director, assistant directors, licensed academic teachers, teacher assistants, and dedicated volunteers. Academic teachers are certified in the state of Tennessee and specialize in their respective subjects, while elective teachers are highly qualified to instill self-confidence through new skills and experiences.

Participants will engage in activities to boost self-esteem, resolve conflicts, develop life values, and learn etiquette and social interaction skills. They will also have opportunities for physical development through various recreational activities that utilize gross motor skills.

Mini seminars led by experienced consultants will address topics aimed at improving interactions with peers, family, friends, and neighbors. Values such as strength of character, integrity, reliability, courtesy, politeness, loyalty, enthusiasm, initiative, responsibility, and courage will be emphasized to increase their potential for success.

# WHAT TO BRING

### **Breakfast**

Campers who arrive between 7 a.m. - 7:50 a.m. may eat the breakfast provided or bring their own breakfast.

### Lunch

Lunch will be provided for campers each day, but you may also choose to pack a nutritious lunch for your camper, including a drink, in an insulated lunch sack or cooler. With increased outdoor activity, campers typically eat more than they do at school, so we provide an afternoon snack. You may also pack an additional afternoon snack if needed.

### Water Bottle

Campers will be exercising and outside periodically during the day, so a reusable water bottle is a must! The camp has many water fountains so that campers can refill their water bottles.

### Clothing

Campers should wear clothing that is comfortable and appropriate for indoor and outdoor activities. Campers are expected to always dress modestly and wear shirts, except when swimming. When swimming is scheduled, campers need to bring a swimsuit, sunscreen, and a towel. If your child gets cold easily you may send them with a light jacket or sweater for cold classrooms.

### Shoes

Please have your campers wear tennis shoes with socks. Due to running activities and hilly terrain tennis shoes are strongly recommended. Flip Flops are prohibited except when worn to the swimming pool.

### **Other Items**

Campers should also bring non-aerosol sunscreen and non-aerosol insect repellent with them to camp every day. Camp Zion staff will not administer any medication.

### **School Supplies**

A supply list will be given to parents during the first week of camp.



# **DISCIPLINE POLICY**

Discipline at Camp Zion is deeply rooted in scripture, as outlined in **Proverbs 12:1, 13:18, and 24, Ephesians 5:1-4, Hebrews 12, and Corinthians 13.** It is viewed as a means ordained by God for character building and behavioral training. Consequences for misbehavior include loss of privileges, time-outs, and physical exertion, however positive reinforcement will be utilized when possible. Parents will be contacted in cases where behavioral patterns are of concern, fostering a collaborative approach to support improvement.

While Camp Zion respects the authority of parents within their homes, we also encourage the importance of discipline aligned with biblical principles. Thus, parents are expected to maintain a code of conduct at home that complements the behavior regulation enforced at Camp Zion.

Students are also expected to demonstrate respect towards staff, volunteers, and peers at all times, adhering to camp rules. Discipline is administered with objectives such as maintaining an optimal learning environment, correcting disruptive behavior, guiding students towards holistic development, and as a last resort, removing students who consistently defy camp rules.

Consequences for rule-breaking include immediate dismissal for fighting, verbal warnings followed by time-outs and suspension of privileges or physical activities for disrespectful behavior towards staff. Parents can schedule meetings with the Director or Executive Director through email for further discussions. Additional details and explanations will be provided during the parent orientation.





#### My child was a camper last year, do I still need to submit all of the forms?

Yes. Your child's information needs to be renewed each year for record keeping purposes.

#### Can my child camp part-time?

Yes. Your registration is for the full summer, and you may choose to miss several days or weeks. However, payments will continue to be drafted from your account and days missed are not prorated or refundable.

#### Is there transportation?

One-way shuttle transportation is provided from the Mt. Zion Antioch location to the Mt. Zion Old Hickory Blvd location for an additional fee of \$20 per week per child. This amount will be added to your weekly fees. Sign-in for the bus begins at 6:30am. A bus counselor is available to answer any questions and discuss any special needs for the day. After you sign your child in, you may choose to stay and see the bus off, or you may leave your child in the care of the bus counselor. All campers are picked up at the Camp Zion day camp site.

#### What if I need to withdraw my child from camp?

All cancellations must be made in writing through email and sent to dwalker@mtzionnashville.org. Parents are responsible for all weekly fees. No refunds will be issued.

#### Is orientation required?

All parents are expected to attend the parent orientation on Saturday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025, at 11 a.m. at 7594 Old Hickory Blvd, Whites Creek Tn. Parents will also have the opportunity to meet the camp staff and tour the camp site.

#### What should I send with my child to camp?

There are no required items to bring to camp but please be sure to label everything you send to camp with your campers' first and last name.



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
